No goods or services were provided in exchange for any part of this tax-deductible donation. WCE is an IRS 501 c 3 tax-exempt organization incorporated in Massachusetts. Our IRS 501 c 3 # is 04-3529016.

The computers that you kindly donated were shipped in a container of 400 Pentium computers that were shipped to help connect schools in Bihar state in India to the Internet. WCE reuses donated computer equipment to bridge the informational divide for poor youth in Africa, Asia, and Latin America. This shipment is part of our plans this year to ship 5,000 computers with a US resale value of \$1,250,000. We support our shipments with capacity-building services from teams of our volunteers. Since we began, we have shipped over 10,000 computers to help connect to the Internet 1,000 schools with 400,000 students.

World Computer Exchange is pleased to work with World Economic Forum, USAID, UNDP, UNICEF, UNESCO, DANIDA, the Government of Ireland, and Peace Corps Volunteers in several countries.
