The events of the year 2004 will linger in our minds for a long time. We learnt a lot from the surprises, shock, and grief that were presented to us during the course of the year.

IANH Executive officers worked very hard from the moment the news broke about the tsunami tragedy. They were busy answering numerous phone calls from the news media that were anxious to know if any of our families in India were affected by the devastation caused by the tidal waves. They also wanted to know about IANH plans to help the victims. Umang Kumar, a Nashua resident requested us to host a Public Meeting to express grief. We made immediate arrangements to host the event in Nashua Public Library. Additionally, we set up 'IANH-Tsunami Fund' for those who want to send in their contributions to help the victims. Nashua Telegraph and Manchester Union Leader published the story that resulted in numerous contributions from the area residents.

We are currently in the process of screening international organizations that are engaged in rebuilding and follow-up work in India, Sri Lanka, and Indonesian islands. We can help these organizations to rebuild these nations. Our goal is to send donations to organizations that have a good track record and minimal overhead. I will keep you posted on our plans. IANH will be hosting a fundraiser on Saturday February 19<sup>th</sup> (snow date February 20<sup>th</sup>) to raise money for Tsunami fund, ASHA, North-South Foundation (NSF) and our own public service activities. ASHA volunteers visit India and provide service to the needy. NSF offers a number of scholarships for higher education in India to deserving students who are in need of financial resources. As you may know IANH works with NSF to bring the Education contests to New Hampshire. IANH public service activities are well known in the area, especially our service on a continual basis to the homeless in Manchester and Nashua area. We are looking for sponsors for the fundraiser to offset the cost and increase collections.

We have scheduled a number of education and cultural activities in March and April. I look forward to seeing you at these activities.

### An Appeal to My Fellow Indians

"United we stand, Divided we fall" It's a very old adage, but time and again in history, it has proven to be a very powerful statement, and so very true, in any era, we live in.

Public service and working for charitable causes is one way to display our community strength and unity. It also shows how much we care as a community for our fellow Indians and for the whole world. And in the time of natural disaster that Tsunami has brought to India and other countries, I think, we need more of our community support, strength and unity. IANH has taken steps to collect donations, to help the Tsunami victims in India. In

our last executive meeting held in early December, IANH has decided to show increased participation for charitable causes, and one of the initiative it has taken, is to help raise funds for Indian charitable organizations like ASHA and NSF, and help the needy thru them. ### IANH Holds Condolence Meeting for the Tsunami Tragedy

The India Association of New Hampshire (IANH) organized a meeting at Nashua Public Library, Nashua NH on Sunday January 9, 2005 to express sympathy and condolences to those affected by the Tsunami disaster. Prithvi Kumar, President convened the meeting to order. This meeting was attended by area residents and representatives from Manitha Neyam Trust of Sri Lanka, Chinmaya Mission, and IDRF. The press coverage included the NH WMUR-TV, Nashua Telegraph, NH Public Radio (NHPR) and Lowell Sun.

The attendees observed silence to pray for those who died, for those who were left behind and for the safe return of those still missing. Umang Kumar, a Nashua resident read a poem 'Beyond the Snow Belt' by Mary Oliver to express grief. Karthi Chandra, IANH Web Master, spoke about the disaster in Chennai, India. This was followed by a short talk by a member of Sri Lankan community, whose relatives were affected by the disaster.

Ms. Barinder Ahluwalia, IANH Public Service Chair outlined our strategy to distribute funds to organizations in the affected areas. The contributions raised by IANH will be used to rebuild the affected areas, for long-term help with settlement and for medical help. 'We are considering organizations that provide service in Indonesia, Sri Lanka and India. Our goal is not how much to raise but find grass roots organizations that provide service to people,' said Barinder. There were discussions on a number of organizations in the area, their activities and commitments. The group agreed in principle to the idea of connecting NH community to the people in the affected area.

Manoj Chaurasia, IANH Director of Media Relations, informed the attendees about our upcoming Fundraiser on February 19, 2005. This is going to be a grand variety cultural entertainment program with performances by our members and professional artists from the New England area at the Merrimack High School. He requested the audience to inform their friends and family about this event and support the fund-raising activity. A substantial percentage of the funds raised will go to the Tsunami Disaster Relief fund.
